



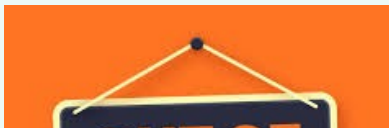

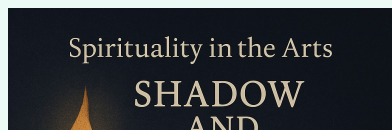

Join the Wake County Black Farmer to Church CSA

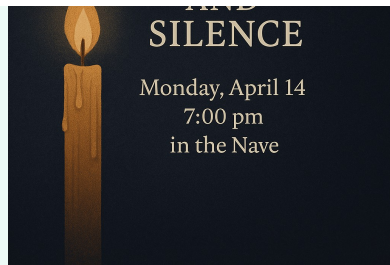

By connecting farmers of color with faith communities, we support sustainable farming and provide access to fresh, healthy food. For Spring 2025, full shares are \$300 (feeds four) and half shares are \$150 (feeds two), with weekly deliveries to the church—enough veggies for about six meals per person.

Service hours will be certified for youth volunteers.

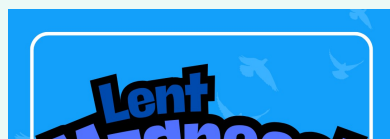


Save the Date - Vacation Bible School
