


# The Justice Theater Project Youth Summer Theater Camp

### Walk in Love: Adult Confirmation Class


This fall, the Bishop will visit Nativity for the rites of Confirmation and Reception. To prepare, we'll read Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs and Practices by Scott Gunn and Melody Wilson Shobe. This six-week class meets Mondays from 7 to 8:30 pm on Zoom, beginning June 23 (with a break on July 7). Open to adults 16 and up, the course explores Episcopal beliefs, sacraments, the liturgical year, prayer, and more. ### **Education for Ministry**
