THE PROLOGUE OF JOHN

John 1: 1–14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. THE LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

Leader We light this candle to remember God's promise of hope. This Advent, Paul reminded us that the day of the Lord is near, calling us to live with hope, integrity, and faith. Hope can mean something we wish for, like a dream or a desire. But it can also mean trusting with confidence in the certainty of God's promises.

People **Come, Lord Jesus, come.**

Leader We light this candle to remember God's gift of peace. The prophet Isaiah reminded us of God's promise of a peaceful kingdom, where justice reigns, and all creation lives in harmony. Peace can mean the absence of conflict, but it also means being still in our hearts, resting in the assurance of God's presence.

People **Come, Lord Jesus, come.**

Leader We light this candle to celebrate God's joy in our hearts. The psalmist reminded us that our joy is found in trusting the Lord, who brings justice, compassion, and hope.. Joy can mean happiness, a momentary delight. But it can also mean abiding contentment, rooted in the deep understanding of God's love and the dignity of every human being.

People **Come, Lord Jesus, come.**

Leader We light this candle to share God's great love with the world. Matthew reminded us that Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us," born through God's saving love. Love can mean affection or a warm feeling, but it is also an active choice—selfless, enduring, and demonstrated in acts of kindness and grace.

People **Come, Lord Jesus, come.**

Leader Tonight, we light the Christ Candle to celebrate the arrival of Jesus. The Gospel of Luke tells us of angels proclaiming the good news: "To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." The light of Christ reminds us that Jesus brings hope, peace, joy, and God's love into the world. This light is not just a guide in darkness but also a source of life.



THE HOLY GOSPEL

Luke 2:1–20

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see-- I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.


