

In this season of Thanksgiving, we are deeply grateful to all who have made a pledge for 2026. As of November 29, we had received total pledges of \$358,097 from 95 families and individuals. The average pledge is \$3769. Thank you to all of those who have made their pledges for 2026. This represents 71.6% of our goal. Spirituality in the Arts: *Sing a Song of Christmas*

Spirituality in the Arts: *Sing a Song of Christmas* will take place on **Tuesday, December 9** at 7 pm in the Nave. This special concert invites you to experience the beauty and depth of Christmas through music and story. Musicians from Nativity will perform nine beloved carols, both ancient and modern, each paired with a brief reflection on its history or meaningful associations. From *Silent Night*, first written for guitar when an organ failed and later sung during the World War I Christmas Truce, to other songs shaped by faith, culture, and hope, this evening will illuminate part of the spiritual heart of Christmas.



The Nativity Bowl: Help Choose Church of the Nativity's Favorite Carol



Continue watching your inbox this week for ballots, and make your selections each time to help decide which carol comes out on top.




The Songs We Sing: Four Carols of Christmas


Young Adult Bible Study

Sacred Ground


This winter, Nativity will offer *Sacred Ground*, a dialogue series from The Episcopal Church on race, faith, and history, in partnership with Christ Church, Raleigh. Through films, readings, and prayerful small-group conversation, participants will explore the story of race in America and its ongoing impact. A group will meet at Nativity on Tuesday evenings from **January 6 to March 17** and conclude with a retreat on March 21. Nativity members may also join one of three additional Christ Church circles—two in person (at Christ Church) and one virtual. Each group follows the same curriculum, is limited to 15 participants, and [requires registration](#).



Adult Confirmation Class: *Walk in Love*

This spring, the Bishop will visit Nativity for the Rites of Confirmation and Reception on May 10. To prepare, we'll read *Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs and Practices* by Scott Gunn and Melody Wilson Shobe. This five-week class meets Wednesdays from 7 to 8:30 pm, beginning **January 14**. Open to all adults 16 and up, the study will explore Episcopal beliefs, sacraments, the liturgical year, prayer, and more. 
Nativity's Christmas Pageant


Youth Christmas Potluck and White Elephant Gift Exchange

Acts of the 210th Annual Convention Now Available

The 210th Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina adopted several important acts, including the transfer of Christ Church, Albemarle to the Sandhills Convocation; affirmations of *Migration with Dignity* and ongoing Reparations and Restitution work; renewed commitment to evangelism and Christian formation; and the creation of a Holy Land Subcommittee to support peace and justice efforts.
