



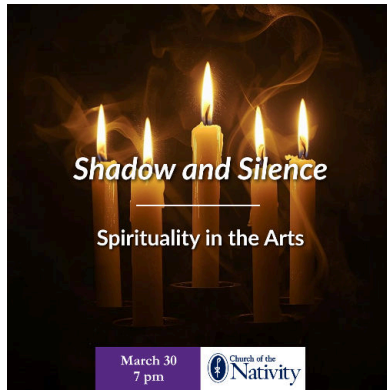

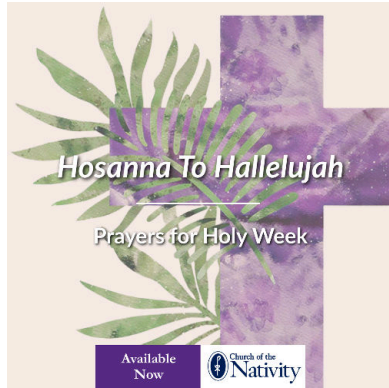

Holy Week Blessing Bags

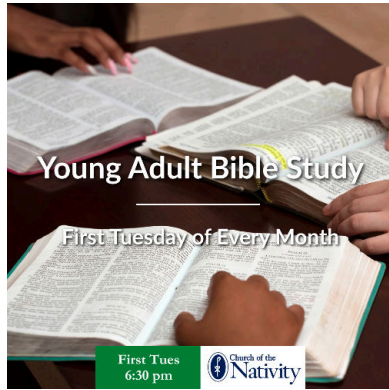

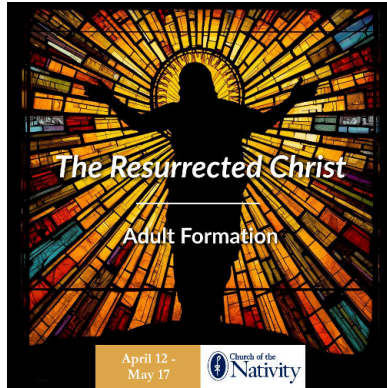
Holy Week Devotional: *Hosanna to Hallelujah!*

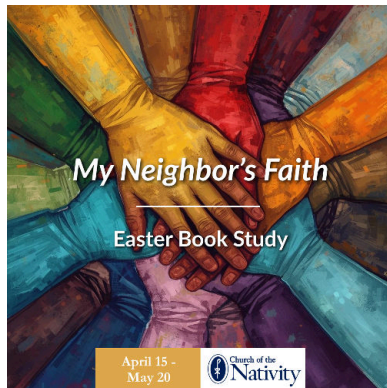
Young Adult Bible Study

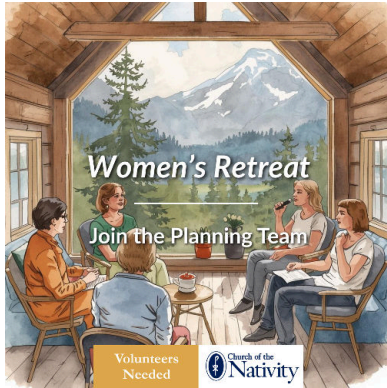
The Resurrected Christ

A new Sunday morning study, *The Resurrected Christ*, will meet **April 12–May 17**, from 9:30–10:20 am in Curry Hall, Room 204, led by the Rev. Dr. Jim Melnyk. Through readings from the Gospels, Acts, and Paul's letters, participants will explore several biblical accounts of encounters with the risen Christ: on the road, by the sea, at the empty tomb, and beyond. Each class begins with a brief practice of Lectio Divina, followed by discussion reflecting on how these stories shape our understanding of resurrection, recognition, and response. Women's Retreat Planning Team

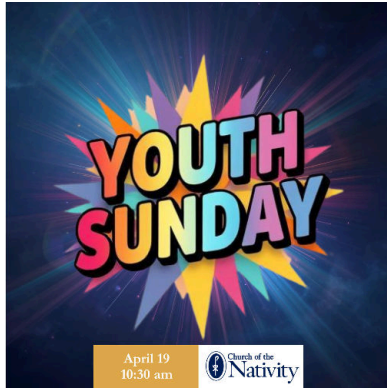

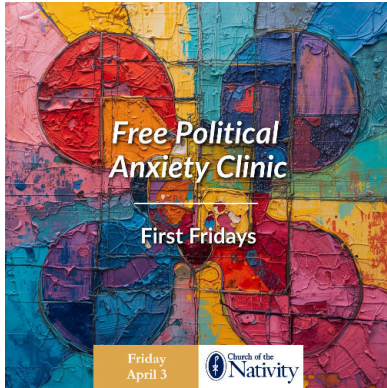


VBS Save the Date!
