



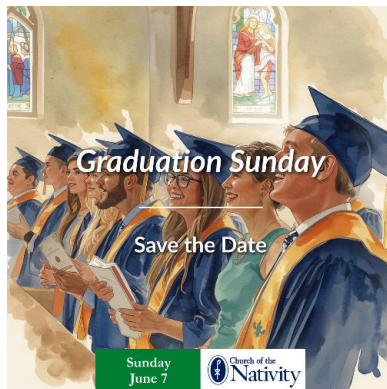

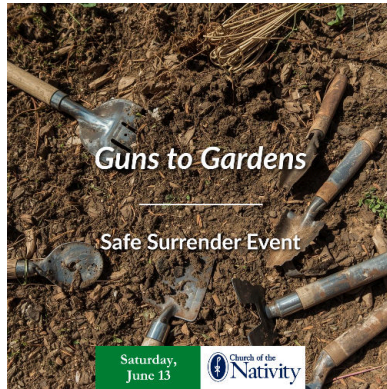

Graduation Sunday and Cookout

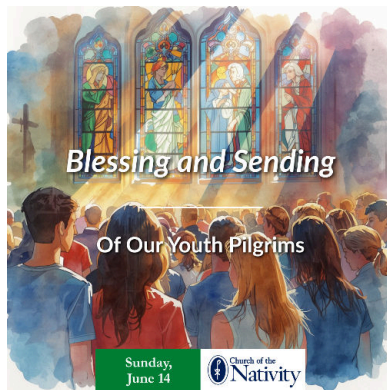

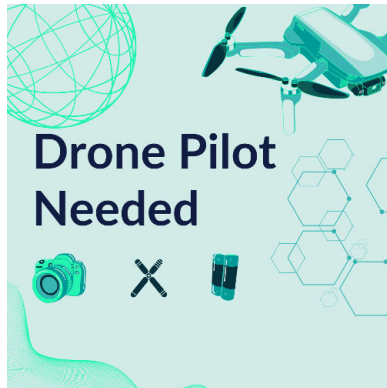
Blessing and Sending of Youth Pilgrims

During the 10:30 am celebration of Holy Eucharist on **Sunday, June 14**, our parish will commission fourteen youth pilgrims and four adult leaders as they prepare to journey to Richmond and Williamsburg for the 2026 Youth Pilgrimage: *Roots & Renewal*. Together they will explore the history of the Anglican and Episcopal traditions, reflect on questions of faith and belonging, and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit as they continue writing their chapter of the Church's story.

Drone Pilot Needed

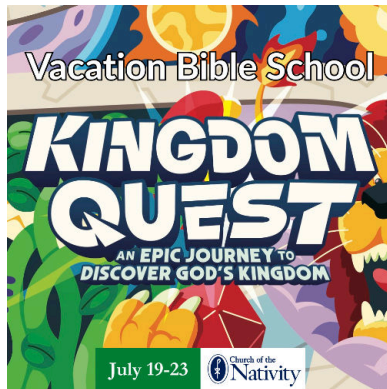

Children's Formation Summer Update

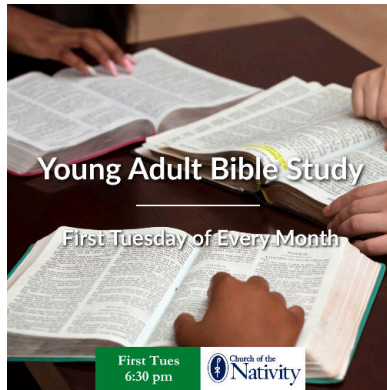

Kingdom Quest VBS: An Epic Journey to Discover God's Kingdom

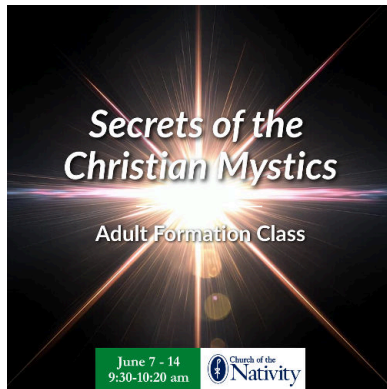

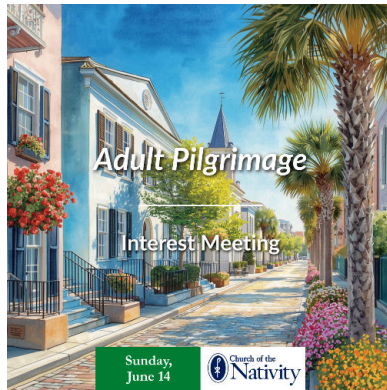
Young Adult Bible Study

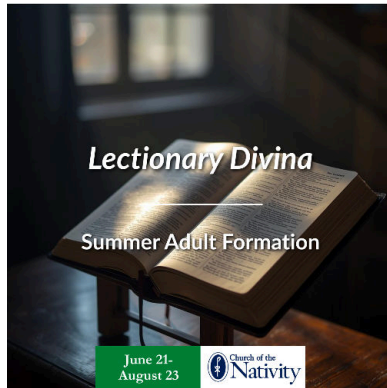
Secrets of the Christian Mystics - Part 2
